



Dr. ROBERT NAHUET, has worked for Library and Archives Canada (National Archives of Canada) since 2001. While employed in the private archives sector, Robert participated in the Metadata Catalytic Initiative. In February 2007, he became an archivist for the Government Records Branch. Having participated in different projects devoted to digital archives, he became a member of the LAC Digital Office in 2008-2009. The following year, he became involved in the Recordkeeping section and gave training sessions on Multi-Institutional Disposition Authorities and Retention Guidelines, both to LAC and other departments employees. In 2010-2011, Robert acted as a Standards and Archival Systems specialist. Since January 2012, Robert is a member of the Archival Strategies team within the Resource Discovery sector. Robert has accumulated many years of experience in archival science, in records management as well as historical records, both as a professional practitioner and as a theorist. He has been professor of archival science and director of the archival certificate program at Laval University. He has worked both in the public sector (municipalities, universities) and the private sector (Systematix, Teleglobe Canada, National Bank of Canada). Robert has been involved in archival science professional associations for many years. He has been a member, a committee leader and the president of the Association des archivistes du Québec. Robert has also been the Secretary General of the Bureau of Canadian Archivists and a member of the Canadian Committee on Archival Description, of the Committee on Best Practices of the International Council on Archives (CBPS-ICA), and of the Steering Committee for the Section of Professional Associations of the ICA. Robert is also a member of the International Institute for Archival Science (IIAS) since 2006. Robert has a Ph. D. in archival science and had published many articles in professional journals, such as *Archives* (Association des archivistes du Québec), *Atlanti* (IIAS), *La Gazette des archives* (Association des archivistes français), and *Arbido* (Associazione degli Archivisti Svizzeri, Biblioteca Informazione Svizzera).
